THE WEDDING VOWS

Then the Lord brought to my mind the vows mentioned during a wedding ceremony. "Will you love, honor, and keep him/her, in sickness and in health; and forsaking all others, keep thee only unto him/her, so long as ye both shall live?" Both parties are to agree to these terms. In my relationship with the Lord He has made a covenant with me and I'm in covenant with Him. That means my relationship with Him is not to be fickle, but solid. He has promised to love, comfort, honor and keep me and has never changed or missed a beat in maintaining His promise. He does this no matter what I do. In other words, He keeps His promise and it's not contingent on my actions. That means I must keep my promise to love him, honor, obey and serve him at all times. No type of setback or change in my life should motivate me to squelch my promise to Him. I should maintain it no matter what happens. Sickness, losses, disappointments, obstacles, etc are not valid reasons to void my relationship commitment. He continues to maintain His even when if I get out of line, surely, since He is perfect, I should be willing to maintain my relationship with Him under any and all circumstances.

Bottom line is, our love affair with Jesus should last till the rapture and it should not be treated lightly, casually or as an on-again, off-again affair. He deserves our love commitment perpetually just as He has perpetually given His love to us.
